

I. WILD WISDOM GLOBAL CHALLENGE: A TIMELINE

The Wild Wisdom Global Challenge (WWGC), an annual initiative by WWF-India since 2008, is an exciting and interactive program that invites students to dive into the fascinating world of biodiversity and wildlife conservation. Designed to spark curiosity and inspire action, this initiative encourages children from an early age to discover their vital role in protecting nature.

WWF-India's mission is to nurture future environmental leaders by empowering young minds to make thoughtful, impactful decisions for the planet. By fostering responsibility and impelling students to take meaningful action, the program is shaping a generation ready to tackle tomorrow's environmental challenges head-on.

Dynamic webinars, interactive workshops and exciting quizzes are designed to spark curiosity and teamwork. Through these initiatives, the challenge transforms environmental education into an unforgettable adventure! Along the way, students not only uncover the wonders of wildlife but also learn how they can actively safeguard our planet's natural treasures for generations to come.

II. THE THEME

THE ULTIMATE SCALY SURVIVALISTS: REPTILES

For millions of years, reptiles have endured on this planet as silent witnesses to the ever-changing rhythms of life on Earth. Yet, despite their incredible history and remarkable adaptations, these creatures remain shrouded in mystery. Their scaly armour and slithery movements have led to myths and misconceptions about them, looked upon with fear and prejudice by humans. But underneath the scales, these fascinating beings boast of great resilience and a quiet tenacity that are essential for maintaining nature's balance – controlling pests, supporting food chains, and thriving in some of the planet's toughest environments!

This year's theme, "The Ultimate Scaly Survivalists," led participants into the hidden realms of reptiles, uncovering extraordinary tales of adaptation. From challenging common myths to discovering little-known facts, students gained insight into how reptiles have endured for millions of years, and in the process developed a deep admiration for them. Learning about the silent strength of a crocodile gliding through still waters or witnessing the delicate grace of a chameleon blending seamlessly with its surroundings helped create an understanding of the importance of these and other reptiles — and a keen desire to protect the fragile world that they so elegantly inhabit.

With bold ambition and even wider inclusivity, the Wild Wisdom Global Challenge 2024 united students in classrooms across continents, cultures, and communities in the cause of learning about, and protecting, our planet's biodiversity.



EMPOWERING HALF A MILLION STUDENTS ACROSS 2,600 SCHOOLS IN INDIA

The Wild Wisdom Global Challenge 2024 reached over 400,000 students from 2,600 schools, spanning government, tribal, rural, and private institutions. This extraordinary outreach ensured inclusivity and celebrated the diversity of India's educational landscape.

GLOBAL PARTICIPATION FROM 16 LOCATIONS FROM ACROSS THE WORLD

With participants from 16 international locations, the challenge became a global stage for young conservationists, all of whom share a passionate admiration for wildlife. The Wild Wisdom Global Challenge illustrates that conservation truly knows no borders – students from around the world met at the international finale to discover their common love and responsibility towards the planet.

EXPERT-LED SESSIONS THAT INSPIRED THOUSANDS

Six riveting sessions brought the natural world to life for over **3,900 participants**. Leading experts like **Mr. Gerry Martin, Dr. Nikhil Whitaker, Dr. Gowri Shankar, Dr. Varad Giri and Ms. Sneha Dharwadkar** shared stories that delved into the intricate lives of reptiles and their ecological significance, sparking curiosity and igniting a passion for conservation in our young participants.

EXPANDING HORIZONS

The Wild Wisdom Global Challenge reached some of India's most remote regions in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep, as well as students in the tough terrains of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. Enthusiastic participation from these areas, where conservation is most needed, highlights a steady rise in environmental awareness among the younger generation.

TRANSFORMING GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS INTO CONSERVATION HUBS

Over 1,000 government schools participated in the Wild Wisdom Global Challenge 2024, engaging 88,961 students across India. Special on-ground sessions in 30 New Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC) schools fostered hands-on awareness.

ENGAGING TRIBAL SCHOOLS FOR A GREENER FUTURE

A major milestone this year was the participation of 252 tribal schools in Telangana, a significant step in bringing conservation education to under-served communities, reflecting the challenge's commitment to inclusivity so that students everywhere can play an active role in wildlife conservation.

ENCOURAGING INDIA'S FUTURE HERPETOLOGISTS

A major highlight this year was a special message from India's legendary "Snake Man," Mr. Romulus Whitaker, along with renowned herpetologists and wildlife conservationists, urging students to take part in the challenge and become champions for reptiles.

straight to participants' screens.







DAY 1: 20 JANUARY **2025, MONDAY**








DAY 4: 23 JANUARY 2025, **THURSDAY**
